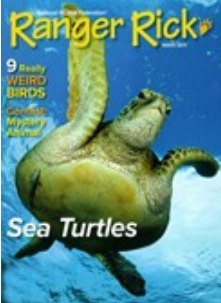

## CRIS Radio To Launch Kids On-Demand

CRIS Radio is expanding its programming to include children's magazines. We are officially kicking off our launch of Kids On-Demand on Monday, Sept. 26. The new programming will initially feature about 12 children's magazines, with the focus on science, technology, the environment and math (STEM).



There are an estimated 72,000 children in Connecticut receiving special education services.



CRIS Radio will be the first in the nation to offer comprehensive, on-demand audio text conversions of children's magazines. It will be available as podcasts, on smartphones and as downloads from CRIS Radio's Web site,

Extensive research has found that children learn better if read to by a person in contrast to a computerized voice.

The annual Kids On-Demand subscription will cost \$30 for unlimited downloads. The first 200 subscribers will receive a free MP3 player with earphones.
