In the white states, men have given the women the full or presidential suffrage or have ratified the Federal Suffrage Amendment.
In the black states they have not.

Because it has given its women nothing but the school vote.

HOW CAN IT BECOME WHITE?

By ratifying the Federal Suffrage Amendment.

Connecticut men and women are now asking Governor Holcomb to call a special session of the legislature to ratify this amendment so that **ALL** the women of the United States may vote in 1920.
