CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RATIFYING THE PROPOSED
AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES ON
WOMAN SUFFRAGE.

WHEREAS, the Sixty-sixth Congress of the United States of America,
in both Houses by a constitutional majority of two-thirds thereof has
made the following proposition to amend the Constitution of the
United States, in the following words, to wit:

Joint Resolution

Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution extending the Right of
Suffrage to Women:

RESOLVED, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the
United States of America, in Congress assembled, two-thirds of each
house concurring therein, that the following article is proposed as an
Amendment to the Constitution, which shall be valid to all intents and
purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the Legislatures of
three-fourths of the several state.

ARTICLE XIX

THE RIGHT OF CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES TO VOTE
SHALL NOT BE DENIED OR ABRIDGED BY THE UNITED STATES [SIC]
OR BY ANY STATE ON ACCOUNT OF SEX.

CONGRESS SHALL HAVE POWER TO ENFORCE THIS ARTICLE
BY APPROPRIATE LEGISLATION:

Therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the General Assembly of the State of Connecticut
that the said proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States
of America be and the same is hereby ratified by the General Assembly of
the State of Connecticut.

RESOLVED, That certified copies of the foregoing preamble and
resolution be forwarded by the Secretary of the State of Connecticut to the
President of the United States, the Secretary of State of the United States,
the President of the Senate of the United States and the Speaker of the
House of Representatives of the United State.
